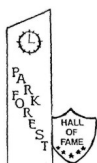

**The 1950s Park Forest House Museum:** The museum is now open Wednesday and Saturday 1-3:30 p.m., in St. Mary's Catholic Church, 227 Monee Road, Park Forest, IL 60466. It can be open by appointment. Contact me at 708-481-4252, or Mike Gans, at 708-305-3308.

**Exhibit:** **"Step Back into a 1950s Valentines Day," February 3– March 5, 2016.** This year the exhibit includes a very **special display of Antique Valentines dating from 1880 up to 1950**, and Valentines decorative items through the decades. Jim St. Ledger of Chicago Heights donated his wife's collection to the Society a few years ago.

Karen Blackful has designed this lovely display for us.

**Volunteers:** We **must** have more volunteers to be docents/tour guides at the museum in order to maintain these hours!! Please be trained to volunteer, and help us stay open in this new location.

**We need a Volunteer Coordinator to schedule docents. Thanks to Vivian Purnell for covering this for at least two months. She had this job for a few years, earlier. Someone else is needed!**

**Board Service:** The Society is looking for Board members. **We must have more active volunteers serving on the board in order to keep operating. We need new blood, and more hands to be able to serve our mission.** Currently, the board meets 2nd Tuesdays, 7 p.m., usually in Park Forest Village Hall. **Active Volunteers and Members:** In order to remain in operation as a Society, we must have more **Active Volunteers** and **more Members**. Too few volunteers are doing too many jobs.

Notice we have not had our 30th Anniversary event? We have a great plan. It would be a fundraiser.

We can't get it off the ground. In January we passed our 31st Anniversary.

**Archive:** We've had an increase in questions, about genealogy, where people lived, and requests from publishers for photographs. A student from Oberlin in Ohio, seeking an article on Ilse Daniels' trip to Bavaria as a post-Holocaust reconciliation, was directed to the article's author, Harriet Marcus Gross in Texas, met with Ilse's daughter, Linda, as well as being sent the article by GSU staff.

Progress documenting the collection continues, which means we will be trying to post more lists of what we own on our website. One volunteer is nearly finished listing a more than 1600 item collection of photographs of Park Forest events, public buildings and the shopping center taken since 1980. A high school-age volunteer had numbered all the items.

Thank you to the Park Forest Public Library for committing to donate \$1350 for half the annual rent. About half of the collection still belongs to the Library.

**The Local History File Cabinets** will be moved to the museum in early April, 2016, to be updated and expanded. **Park Forest newspaper microfilm** has been transferred from the Park Forest Public Library to Governors State University Library. We are all working together to get people articles they need.
