I have been busy writing grants this winter and spring. We have applied to:

- Institute of Museum and Library Services Museums for America Grant trying to get PastPerfect Collections Maintenance Software and an additional computer to run it on.
- CAPS Program--Collections Assessment Program. We have to try again next year if we don't get the PAG.
- NEH Preservation Assistance Grant (PAG) to hire a conservator to evaluate the archive collection and environment and make recommendations to improve our Long Range Plan of Collections Care. This is a stepping stone to other grants.
- Illinois State Historic Records Administration Board (ISHRAB) asking for a new large format scanner and OCR software to begin scanning early Park Forest newspapers, including the first years of the <u>Park For-</u>

est Reporter, Park Forest News, and The Park Forest View. The goal would be to get the newspapers on our project, "Park Forest: An Illinois Planned Community" on Illinois Digital Archives. Check out IDA through our website. We already have sales brochures, photos, articles and 26 oral histories there.

I have taken advantage of several free webinar courses on Disaster Plan Writing, Disaster Recovery, Digitization, & Preservation and Care of Photographs. These were each series of 4 or 5-1.5 hour classes,

The plans arrived, some rolled in bags, some just loose and crumpled. Bob, who was a mechanical engineer, is able to read the plans and record what they show.

Training Institute, where we learned how fire behaves, watched library and museum collection materials being burned by firemen, then went in and recovered them. We all learned a great deal about what happens to storage, packing, and collections in the heat, flames and water. On April 19, I went to Indianapolis for Midwest Archives Conference meetings on Digital Projects, and a presentation by our neighbors, Calumet Heritage Partnership. I always come back with new ideas.

On April 25, we held our first Preservation Week event at the Park Forest Public Library. We showed off many of the books on Park Forest and regional history, oral history transcripts (which are at the library behind the Information Station desk), and offered printouts and booklets on caring for your own collections of family history, along with a list of helpful websites. We featured our free, 14-page publication, "Park Forest History Resources Held by the Park Forest Public Library and the Park Forest Historical Society." Look for copies at the Village Hall, library, museum and Archive Office. We hope everyone will pick up a copy and begin to read some of the oral history transcripts, look at the 270 subject files at the library, and visit the archive to learn more about our history.

Volunteers are making progress documenting the archive collection electronically and on paper. If you have been waiting for me to call you in to be given a volunteer assignment, I hope you can see that I have been busy trying to get funding and equipment for the projects we need to do. I should be calling soon to get you started on jobs!

On June 6, we hosted the Local History Group South of Chicago, for a quick tour of the museum and Archive Office, featuring many of the ways we have celebrated anniversaries in town. Anniversary Celebrations was the subject of the meeting.
