

75th Anniversary of Park Forest News

The Society began celebrating the 75th Anniversary of Park Forest in August 2023 marking the 75th Anniversary of the first move-ins. The Village of Park Forest will kick off its 75th Anniversary year by marking the February 1, 1949 Incorporation date and will continue its celebration throughout 2024.

A small 75th Anniversary Ad Hoc Committee, chaired by Trustee Theresa Settles will call on community members for help planning events. The 75th Kick-off cake cutting is scheduled for February 1, 2024 from 5-8 p.m. at Freedom Hall, 410 Lakewood Blvd. The public is invited. Actual cake-cutting is planned for about 6 p.m. The Society will provide history displays. The Village is designing a brief history video and plans to have a video booth for brief resident interviews.

We have been contacted by a member of Rich Township High School's first Class of 1954, Mitch Steinberg. Mr. Steinberg would like the Society to solicit memoirs, especially from the class of 1954 members. The Society would like to know when graduates moved to Park Forest and why, where they lived here, then what they accomplished with their lives post-high school graduation.

The Society is interested in receiving memoirs from Park Foresters in general, hopefully in electronic format, to be shared on our website.

We especially encourage alumni of the Rich Township High School district to share their memories of his school and accounts of what
